MINISTRY NEWS marriage conference – slovakia

Julka and I spoke at a marriage conference with the main theme being *"How to Surpass a Mediocre Marriage"*. We discussed the danger of an average marriage which, though convenient, avoids conflict and prevents growth. Deeper intimacy is sacrificed for the sake of safety. Detailed descriptions of the limitations of an average marriage were shared as well as proposals for honest growth. Couples of different ages and life stages attended enabling effective passing of wisdom from one generation to another.

At the same conference we led a seminar about the joy and challenges of raising teenagers. Here too wisdom and experiences were shared.

Other conferences focused on themes such as *"A Christian Marriage"* and *"The Need to be Loved"* as they affect the dynamics of a close relationship.

PASTOR SUPPORT AND MINISTRY

We would like to paint a fairly typical picture for you of our ministry to pastors. A phone call came from a pastor on the edge of burnout, struggling with feelings of being alienated from his work and finding



himself avoiding relationally difficult tasks. Disliking to disappoint anyone, he tended to make promises he realistically could not keep. As a result, people became frustrated with the unmet deadlines and expectations. On top of that a physical injury confined him to his bed for several weeks.

The crisis occurred when he recovered physically and was able to return to work. He quickly realized he was not able to meet all of the expectations placed on him and found himself depressed and completely exhausted with all inner resources depleted. Whenever he thought about ministry work his despair intensified leading to thoughts of feeling abandoned and betrayed by the very God he wished to serve.

"I will rescue you from your own people and from the Gentiles. I am sending you to them to open their eyes and turn them from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan to God, so that they may receive forgiveness of sins and a place among those who are sanctified by faith in me." Acts 26: 17-18

We exist to facilitate the church to be a safe, honest, and intimate place to meet, know, and grow in Christ and His Body. Parakletos creates a safe place through means of individual counseling, seminars, and mentoring.

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Severe exhaustion with features of burnout are typical of the pastors who contact us. Recovery usually

takes several years and requires a solid support system. We are honored and thankful to be able, through God's grace, to have a part in the healing process.

Another pastor called us not because of burnout but because he found himself at a turning point in his life. After successfully planting and developing a new local church, he had a feeling of dissatisfaction. He wished to talk with someone who could *understand* and *listen* as he strove to collect his thoughts. Desiring to do God's will more than ever, to discern God's voice and be obedient to his Lord, yet having some confusion as to what God was asking of him, he sensed he could no longer mechanically continue in ministry. Although he did not know what the new call was, he was convinced a new call from God was being born.

In addition to meeting with these pastors for personal counseling, we offer a four day stay in our town to assist in meeting these kinds of needs. The time is filled with meetings
